




This is a neighborhood Brightwater currently has under construction in Roswell. You will see there was NO space left as greenspace. The homes are on small lots shoved together for maximum density. The homes are within 10 feet of each other. Also please note how the land was clear cut.







This is my favorite false sales pitch of Brightwater. It looks like on their site plan that they left green space in this neighborhood. What they fail to tell you is that the neighborhood backs up to Roswell Area Park and those walking trails are the Parks not the neighborhoods. The only green space left was the buffer of the swamp drainage field of the lake in Roswell Area Park. Again notice the incredibly high density and close proximity of the homes. You will also notice the site plan calls for 14 homes and they shoved in **19 homes!**




This is the neighborhood Brightwater developed in Milton. The homes are on one acre lots. Again you will notice there is NO greenspace. The trees on the right of the picture are the neighbors property. You will notice on the two lots not completed the total clear cutting of the lot. The only trees that were left were in the areas where the ground slopes close to 30 feet behind Gables Walk on both sides.





This is a neighborhood in Marietta being developed. Note the clear cutting of the land. They are shoving 10 homes into this space with again NO greenspace.



This is a neighborhood in Sandy Springs. Again very high density and NO greenspace.
