Tools Needed:

Hedge Trimmers
Power Saws for cutting fallen trees
Pole Saws for cutting limbs

People Needed:

To assist volunteers trimming by moving the limbs and debris off to the side of the trail.

- People sawing, please consult with team leader before cutting a large tree.
- Do not cut Beech or Dogwood trees; however, you may trim these trees.
- Trail Ribbon Knots are facing the trail. Cut back brush 6-feet from this knot.
- Cut small trees to ground level and do not leave a stump that would be hazardous to hikers and horses.



- Cut brush, branches, vines etc. 9-feet high when possible to accommodate height of horse and rider.
- When trimming large tree branches, cut the branch at the trunk and do not leave a portion of the branch that could injure someone.
- Those cleaning up trail debris cut down or previously fallen should just lay it to the side of the trail.
