Election Interference (Part 6): Sequenced Emails Raise Questions of Election Integrity and Mohrig's Personal Ethics

Following is the sequence of events following the dissemination of an email invitation (on September 5th) from Council Member Rick Mohrig for a "strategic planning" meeting to be held at the home of 2 poll workers. Despite a total of 4 requests from Council Member Cookerly and from City Manager Krokoff, Council Member Rick Mohrig has refused to answer a simple yes/no question about whether he attended the meeting with poll workers that was the subject of the email invitation. This question is plainly dispositive in determining whether a computer hack has occurred. Rather Mohrig engages in transparent evasiveness and casts himself as a victim. I urge citizens to read the following email exchange and honestly ask yourself whether Council Member Mohrig is fit to serve on council.

On September 5, 2023, the following calendar invitation was sent by Rick Mohrig. The invitation references a planning meeting on September 7th at the home of two poll workers, giving a location and start/stop times. Considering his long history of egregious election interference, you would think Mohrig would want to avoid even the appearance of impropriety. The optics of such a meeting are certainly awful, to say the least.

Upon being questioned about this invitation by fellow council members, Mohrig responded that he was hacked and that the subject meeting invitation was not from him and that he had nothing to do with it. He demands an investigation. The most logical explanation is that Mohrig did not know what he was doing, likely used another meeting invitation as a template,

and mistakenly sent a meeting invitation for an actual meeting. When called out about it, Mohrig seems to have panicked and sent a **defensive**, **over-the-top denial of any wrongdoing**. There are **2** issues here. One is his use of city resources—his city email and city-provided tablet—for political purposes, which he knows is an ethics violation. Second and more serious is an implied meeting with (at least two) poll workers (a clerk and a tabulator), who have since resigned from their positions.

My apologies to those of you who received the hacked e-mail. This was not from me nor do I have any idea what the subject meeting invite is about. It references a Strategic Meeting with Berry Dunn Consultants and Michelle Kennedy from Berry & Dunn was in the send to addresses. Again, this did not come from me, Councilman Rick Mohrig. I was unaware of the e-mail as it only appears in my Sent file when I searched for it after others, obviously confused by the note, started replying. Please disregard.

It did not show up as an e-mail in my inbox, even though the sender tried sending it to "Elected Officials" (which would have automatically sent a copy to my inbox from me and to Juliette Johnson, Andrea Verhoff & Jan Jacobus as well as all of active Counsel).

It also was addressed to former City Employees (Sara LaDart) and former City Council Members (Laura Bentley and Joe Longoria) at the old City Domain name of "cityofmiltonga.us".

My default City signature tag line & logo are also missing, which is automatically added on all true e-mails originating from me on the City Server. I only became aware of this bogus e-mail when people on this e-mail string with correct e-mails started replying to this early this morning. I did find a copy of the falsified e-mail in my SENT e-mail folder!

Please let me know what you & I can do to fix whatever breach has occurred and how we can trace the source and origination of this person pretending to be me. I and the City cannot afford to have someone impersonating an Elected Official in communications originating from the City Server. I look forward to hearing what we can do to correct this quickly. If this happened to me, it can happen to other City Officials and employees.

Thanks in advance for your assistance.

As requested, City Manager Krokoff conducts an investigation that ties up the City's two information technology specialists for the better part of a day. **No "unauthorized access" is found.**

Thank you for your patience, Councilmember Mohrig.

As I stated in my initial email, there is no evidence of a breach of our system. Our security team was completing an analysis of your tablet to ensure it wasn't compromised, and I believe that is complete with no evidence of it being compromised. To ensure transparency, I've instructed Ashley to coordinate with our security experts at InterDev to draft a report outlining their findings.

While I don't purport to be a cybersecurity expert, I have instructed a course on the topic for many years at the undergraduate level. In my experience, I can confidently state that the activity we observed does not align with typical malevolent actions aimed at gaining unauthorized network access. These usually involve phishing and social engineering techniques to coax users into divulging critical information such as logins and passwords, subsequently providing attackers with opportunities to access sensitive data or install ransomware.

Regarding the calendar invite in question, it appears to be a legitimate event originally created by Tammy Lowit in 2021 for our strategic planning efforts. The perplexing part is how it was subsequently edited to include the Muldowney's information and shifted to a meeting scheduled at their residence in Crooked Creek on Thursday, September 7, 2023. In the absence of further information, we might reasonably conclude that this could be attributed to user error.

However, if you have no connection to the Muldowneys and did not intend to schedule or attend a meeting as indicated in the calendar invite, we are open to exploring additional resources to investigate this matter further. On the other hand, if this meeting indeed represents an actual event, I must inform you that I cannot authorize any further allocation of resources to delve into the issue.

Once again, I appreciate your understanding and cooperation in this matter. If you have any further questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to reach out.

Considering there is zero evidence of hacking, Mohrig chooses to shut down further discussion with council. For the fourth time (he is asked 3 times by Cookerly and once by Krokoff), Mohrig evades answering whether a meeting occurred with poll workers. He pathetically attempts to cast himself as the victim. And he gives hints of a possible (lame) excuse in the event he must fess up that he met with poll workers. He intimates that he might not have known the poll workers were actually . . . poll workers.

Carol,

This will be my last reply to you on this thread.

No one is playing "cat and mouse", at least I am not. I find it troubling that you are making assumptions from an e-mail that I have clearly stated was not sent from me. I would think you would be concerned about the hack to my and the City's e-mail system. Someone somehow infiltrated the City Server and my e-mail to create and send a fake e-mail pretending to be me. I clearly stated that when I forwarded the e-mail with my comments to Steve, our Director of IT and Council the morning after the impersonated e-mail was sent.

In that e-mail, I explained the incident that occurred and requested an investigation as to find who perpetrated the hack. I will not discuss the investigation in open e-mails to all of Council. It should be of concern to you and Council that the same thing could have occurred or be done to you. It is a security breach issue that needs to be investigated.

As far as your stated concerns about the integrity of our future elections, I have full confidence in our City Manager (and Election Superintendent) that he and his staff will conduct a fair, secure and open Municipal election, just as in all past City of Milton Municipal Elections when Fulton County administered them.

Also, to clarify, I have never seen nor been made aware of any list of Poll Workers selected to administer our Election. Have you been provided a list of Poll Workers?

As for your implied accusations of inappropriate meetings or election interference, I have not been involved in the organization or planning of our local election, nor should ANY Council Member. That is the sole responsibility of the City Manager in our case. The outside accusations that occurred have been clearly debunked and corrected by our Legal Counsel's Open letter last week to the State Elections Board in direct response to Attorney Brian Sells letter to the same Board dated August 22, 2023. I believe all of Council has been copied on both letters, but I will forward a copy of Mr. Jarrard's letter to all of you in case you missed it.

I remain committed to serving the best interests of our community, and I trust that truth and justice will prevail.

Realizing she has Mohrig on the ropes, Cookerly goes in for the kill. Mohrig has nowhere to go. Cookerly's arguments are airtight and irrefutable . . . and her delivery of a series of knock-out punches is masterful. Surely, the rest of council sees the writing on the wall.

Council Member Juliette Johnson weighs in first and **correctly argues that Mohrig should get what he requested: a full investigation.** She expresses what most engaged citizens have been thinking and saying . . . that **Mohrig must finally be held accountable** for the many problems he has created at City Hall.

Just wanted to let you know I am in full support of an investigation. This issue was brought to us by Rick, himself. I would hate to see it fade away with out repercussions like has happened with previous problems he has created.

Mayor Jamison seeks a majority of council's approval for an investigation in the matter. The mayor and council each have the authority to order such an investigation; however, the mayor seems reluctant to unilaterally order such an investigation without support of at least 3 additional council members. It seems the mayor has majority support if Mohrig is counted as a "yes" vote. Johnson and Cookerly both support such an investigation. However, as of my writing of this blog post, such an investigation does not seem to have yet been ordered.

Out of an abundance of caution and as a courtesy to Mohrig, Mayor Jamison sends a separate email to Mohrig to verify that Mohrig does indeed desire an investigation. (I would not have extended such a courtesy, but rather counted Mohrig as a "yes" vote considering that he has repeatedly called for an investigation.) As of this writing, Mohrig had not responded by email to the mayor's query.
